CHUUK VISITORS BUREAU BOARD OF DIRECTORS NEW NOMINEES FOR 2-YEARS TERM

Pursuant to Chuuk State Public Law number 11-12-05, which amends Section 3 of the Truk State Law number 6-39 relating to the composition of the Visitors Bureau Board of Directors, allowing the Governor to nominate three (3) members, subject to the advice and consent of the House of Senate, and permitting the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to appoint two (2) members, The Honorable Governor Alexander R. Narruhn is in the processes of communicating with certain individuals he is considering as prospective nominees.

CVB is grateful to the three gentlemen with expiring terms for their leadership the past few years, namely Mr. Myron Hashiguchi, long time chairman of the Board, as well as Mr. Don Sean Mori and Mr. Wonpat Rold.

The Legislature has yet to appoint the second appointee to serve along with Mr. Krisos Victus, Director of the Department of Marine Resources, who has nearly one more year of valid term.

Governor Narruhn looks to expedite his selection process in order to have the nominations submitted to the House of Senate for their scrutiny and approval soon as possible.

AGENCIES CONSIDER WAYS TO POOL RESOURCES AND IMPACT COMMUNITY-DRIVEN ENVIRONMENT CARE

few weeks ago, a small group of brainstormers gathered at the Truk Stop Hotel with one mission: to suggest ways to pool together resources from offices and programs that can directly impact community work for sanitation and environment care. The group chose to pilot their work at one section of the Mechitiw Village, following the opening of the Rachel's Beach Resort last month.

The group needs to bring in the Chuuk Environment Protection Agency for their on-going community cleaning support, the Department of Marine Resources for their coastal enhancement assistance access, and the Department of Agriculture for their expertise in home gardening and sustainable methods for environment sensitive piggery.

The inter-agency group recognizes the vital role traditional leaders and civil organizations play as the main movers of community driven endeavors, including the youth, women group, and church ministries and services.

Some of the youth were able to also visit places around Weno, such as the Xavier High School, and go swimming. A few went to play in on-going tournament on Fefen Island on Sunday. Others enjoyed picnics with families.

Chuukese athlete ever to compete at the Pacific Games. He has swum at the Olympics when he represented FSM at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.
